





Labs


- 7 labs in total: from Lab 0 to Lab 6,
- Mandatory
- Graded,
- you need your own laptop (with 7GB available storage space),
- you will work in groups of 2: only one report per group,
- You are completely safe to work on labs remotely.

On Moodle

- Some lab reports consist of the filled-in pdf we provide (Adobe Reader XI supports saving pdf forms, not all readers do!),
- submit the report and the requested code on Moodle in the submit links that will be available in due time.

Quiz/Lab submission flowchart:

- Online Quizzes are individual: one quiz per student
- Labs are group based, a group can have at most 2 students: only one report per group.
